



* **NOTE:** On average, final duties are not assessed until 3 years after import. But, litigation can extend that time period considerably.

** **NOTE:** The investigation only sets a cash deposit rate, which would be superseded by the final results of a review. Therefore, if the litigation regarding the investigation extends over several years, the rate may diminish its impact.

****NOTE:** Commerce normally makes scope decisions based on the language defining the scope of the order. However, to prevent circumvention of an order, Commerce also has the authority to include: (1) products that have been altered in minor respects; (2) products made from parts and components from the subject country that undergo minor final assembly or processing in a third country or the US; and (3) products that have been investigated.
